

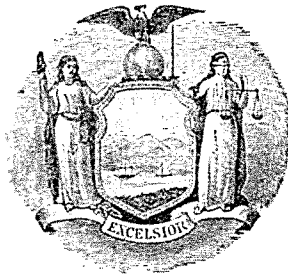

exempt from paying tax; which was read and referred to the committee on taxation and retrenchment.

Also, a petition of Sabin McKarney relating to mutual life insurance companies doing business in New York State; which was read and referred to the committee on insurance.

Leave of absence was granted to Messrs. Bradford and Cornell till Wednesday, February 12th, and to Messrs. Page and Nixon till Wednesday night, February 12th.

The Senate returned the Senate bill entitled "An act to sanction and legalize the action of the stenographers of the Senate and Assembly in certain cases, and to authorize the board of claims to hear, audit and determine their claims against the State for compensation for services and disbursements, and to make awards therefor" (Rec. No. 7), with a message that they have concurred in the amendments of the Assembly thereto.

Ordered, That the Clerk return said bill to the Senate.

The Senate sent for concurrence the following entitled bills:

"An act to fix the duration of the term of office of the surrogate in the city and county of New York" (Rec. No. 19), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on affairs on cities.

"An act to amend chapter 397 of the Laws of 1873, entitled 'An act for the incorporation of fire, hose, and hook and ladder companies'" (Rec. No. 20), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on general laws.

"An act to authorize the judges of the Court of Appeals to appoint a messenger, and providing for the payment of the same" (Rec. No. 21), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Huson introduced a bill entitled "An act to repeal section 4 of title 2 of chapter 13 of part 1 of the Revised Statutes, regulating the place in which real property should be assessed in certain cases, where divided by division line of towns, wards or counties" (Int. No. 407), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on taxation and retrenchment.

Mr. Gardenier introduced a bill entitled "An act to amend and revise chapter 55 of the Laws of 1881, entitled 'An act in relation to the public schools in the city of Hudson, and to create a board of education for said city'" (Int. No. 408), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on public education.

Mr. Shields introduced a bill entitled "An act releasing the interest of the people of the State of New York in certain real estate situate in the city of Brooklyn, county of Kings, to Edward McDermott, Margaret McDermott, Francis McDermott, Mary McDermott, James McDermott and Marcella McDermott" (Int. No. 409), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the judiciary.

Mr. Bridges (by request) introduced a bill entitled "An act to amend chapter 534 of the Laws of 1879, entitled 'An act for the preservation of moose, wild deer, birds and other game,' as amended by chapter 584 of the Laws of 1880" (Int. No. 410), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on fisheries and game.

Mr. Curtis introduced a bill entitled "An act changing the name

of 'The St. Lawrence State Asylum for the Insane' to 'The St. Lawrence State Hospital for the Insane'" (Int. No. 411), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the judiciary.

Also, a bill entitled "An act changing the name of 'The Buffalo State Asylum for the Insane' to 'The Buffalo State Hospital for the Insane'" (Int. No. 412), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the judiciary.

Also, a bill entitled "An act to change the name of 'The State Homœopathic Asylum for the Insane at Middletown' to 'The Middletown State Homœopathic Hospital for the Insane'" (Int. No. 413), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the judiciary.

Also, a bill entitled "An act changing the name of the 'State Lunatic Asylum' to the 'Utica State Hospital for the Insane'" (Int. No. 414), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the judiciary.

Mr. Coons introduced a bill entitled "An act to amend chapter 192 of the Laws of 1885, entitled 'An act to amend chapter 291 of the Laws of 1870, entitled An act for the incorporation of villages'" (Int. No. 416), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on affairs of villages.

Also, a bill entitled "An act to amend chapter 466 of the Laws of 1889 entitled 'An act to amend title 17 of chapter 20 of part 1 of the Revised Statutes, entitled Of Dogs'" (Int. No. 417), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal affairs.

Mr. Duffy introduced a bill entitled "An act to amend chapter 140 of the Laws of 1850, entitled 'An act to authorize the formation of railroad corporations, and to regulate the same'" (Int. No. 418), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on railroads.

Mr. Andrus introduced a bill entitled "An act to legalize certain proceedings of the common council and officers of the city of Buffalo" (Int. No. 419), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on affairs of cities.

Also, a bill entitled "An act to authorize the docketing of judgments and decrees of the Circuit and District Courts of the United States, rendered within this State, in the offices of the clerks of the counties of this State" (Int. No. 420), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the judiciary.

Mr. Shields introduced a bill entitled "An act to amend chapter 563 of the Laws of 1888, entitled 'An act to revise and combine in a single act all existing special and local laws affecting public interests in the city of Brooklyn'" (Int. No. 421), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on affairs of cities.

Mr. Gretsinger introduced a bill entitled "An act to incorporate the 'East River Bridge Company,' for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a permanent bridge for passengers and other traffic over the waters between New York and Brooklyn cities, together with all necessary connections, appurtenances, approaches thereto and stations" (Int. No. 422), which was read the first time and referred to the committee on commerce and navigation.

Mr. Kerrigan introduced a bill entitled "An act in relation to racing

claim of Wilbur W. Fish against the State for damages arising from the killing of a glandered horse, by and under the direction of the board of health of the town of Chemung, in the county of Chemung," reported in favor of the passage of the same, which report was agreed to, and said bill placed on the order of second reading.

Mr. Adams, from the committee on public institutions, to which was referred the bill introduced by Mr. Curtis, Int. No. 821, entitled "An act changing the name of 'The Willard Asylum for the Insane' to 'The Willard State Hospital,'" reported in favor of the passage of the same, which report was agreed to, and said bill placed on the order of second reading.

Mr. Treadway, from the committee on fisheries and game, to which was referred the bill introduced by Mr. Pierson, Int. No. 869, entitled "An act for the preservation and protection of the shell fisheries in the waters of the South bay, in the county of Suffolk, and to repeal chapter 234 of the Laws of 1870," reported in favor of the passage of the same, which report was agreed to, and said bill placed on the order of second reading.

The Senate returned the following entitled bills, with a message that they have concurred in the passage of the same:

"An act to amend chapter 776 of the Laws of 1870, entitled 'An act to amend an act entitled An act to provide for the incorporation of villages, passed December 7, 1847, and the several acts amendatory thereof, so far as the same relate to the village of Mount Vernon, in the county of Westchester, and to declare, enlarge and define the powers and duties of the officers of said village and to confirm and extend the powers of the corporation of said village,' as amended by chapter 544 of the Laws of 1887." (No. 503.)

"An act to amend chapter 608 of the Laws of 1886, entitled 'An act to provide and establish a permanent system of sewerage and drainage in the village of Mount Vernon, and in relation to the construction of said system,' as amended by chapter 83, Laws of 1889." (No. 487.)

"An act changing the name of 'The State Lunatic Asylum' to 'The Utica State Hospital.'" (No. 595.)

"An act to change the name of 'The State Homœopathic Asylum for the Insane at Middletown' to 'The Middletown State Homœopathic Hospital.'" (No. 594.)

"An act changing the name of 'The Buffalo State Asylum for the Insane' to 'The Buffalo State Hospital.'" (No. 593.)

"An act changing the name of 'The Saint Lawrence State Asylum for the Insane' to 'The Saint Lawrence State Hospital.'" (No. 592.)

"An act to amend chapter 467 of the Laws of 1889, entitled 'An act to reappropriate the unexpended balance of the amount appropriated by chapter 593, Laws of 1881, entitled An act for the removal of causes of malaria and danger to the public health from a portion of the abandoned Chemung canal and Genesee Valley canal, and making an appropriation for such purpose, and to direct its expenditures for the same object.'" (No. 328.)

Ordered, That the Clerk deliver said bills to the Governor.

On motion of Mr. Sheehan, the House adjourned.
